It has come to our attention that fraudulent emails are being sent out under the guise of INIFAC representatives or board members. These emails falsely request assistance, including making payments or wire transfers, claiming they are on behalf of the board.

INIFAC does not request payments, wire transfers, or any form of financial assistance via email. All payment-related transactions and communication occur only through official links available on our website or other verified channels.

If you receive an email like the examples above or any email that seems suspicious:

- Do not respond or engage with the sender.
- Do not click on any links or attachments in the email.
- Report the email immediately to INIFAC at [www.inifac.org](http://www.inifac.org)

Protect yourself by staying vigilant and verifying communication directly with us through our official website or contact channels.
